

n the world of professional hockey photography, the name Bruce Bennett is the equivalent of mentioning Shaq and Kobe in basketball circles. There is no other photo organization in the world that commands the respect and admiration that hockey crazed Bruce Bennett studies has earned.

Growing Up on Long Island, Bennett was bitten by the hockey and camera bug at an early age. "I attended a Ranger game in 1973 and took photos from the Blue section, said Bennett." "I was 18 years old at the time. I sold the photos to Hockey news for \$3.00 a photo."

From that moment on Bennett knew this was the field for him. Over the years Bennett has amassed a client list that needs like a who's who of hockey.

They Include: The New York Rangers, The New York Isalnders, The Philadelphia Flyers, the New Jersey Devils, the American Hockey League, Bridgeport Sound Tigers, and the Albany River Rats. The N.Y. Power Soccer Team, The N.Y. Dragons, the Professional Indoor Soccer League and the 175 professional teams in the tri-state area.

"Digital Photography is now 65% of our business," said Bennett. That number will surly increase very soon. Many of Bennett's clients are outside the United States, so being able to e-mail images any where in the world immediately is a major advantage. 
